

Marine & Supply Base Operation For Offshore Support

Course Overview

Marine and Supply base Operation for Offshore Support training most often begins with setting goals. These goals are recorded and may be broken down into a project, an action plan, or a simple task list. Activities are then rated based on decision making and route selections, inshore operations, terminal operations & offshore operation, and routing. This process results in a plan with a task list or calendar of activities. Routine and recurring tasks are often given less focus to modes of transport to work on tasks that contribute to important goals.

This entire process is supported by a skill set that should include personal motivation, delegation skills, organization tools, and crisis management. We'll cover all this and more during this workshop. The marine supply base will ensure Darwin has world-class marine infrastructure to support the industrial and developments in the region. The supply base will have dedicated marine berths and support facilities (e.g. fuel and water storage) and will increase Darwin's capacity to support offshore oil and gas developments.

- The operation, handling & characteristics of supply boats
- Tugs and similar vessels
- · Supply vessel load planning, cargo handling and loading bulk and deck cargo
- The role and management of the supply base in support of offshore exploration & production operations
- HSE issues, including regulatory frameworks impacting on safe & effective marine transport and supply base operations
- Ship and container construction; initiate appropriate, prompt and informed action in the event of emergencies; operation of International Trade
- Other logistics activities e.g.:
 - o Warehousing facilities
 - o Cargo Handling
 - o Scheduling
 - o Delivery
 - o Modeling
